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













### about the book

### the story

A man talks to a little girl in Mê Linh, a town in northern Vietnam. He met her at her house. Her name is Liên and time is nothing to her. She lives a ruined existence. Her father contaminated by Agent Orange during the American war transmitted her the disease.

### about the book

Jean Marc Turine met these families who were victims of dioxin. He sends them a long plea supported by factual data. He pours out his anger and his revolt but also his incomprehension, his love and his impotence. A testimony, like a shouted chant, which awakens our consciences.

The form of the book is singular since it combines the documentary form with the poetry of the story.

### about the book


Jean Marc Turine succeeds in keeping this precarious balance, between the distance necessary for writing and the repugnance of the memories evoked; disgust, anger; emotions rise.

There are subjects that we sometimes try to forget that they exist, memories that we would prefer to hide. But what happened existed, and freeing up speech is life-saving, essential. When the testimony is coupled with the quality writing of Jean Marc Turine, the reader lets himself be caught up in this cry from the heart, a real slap that stirs and revolts.

This is not a documentary or biography, it's a literary work from a testimony.

As a starting point for the text, there is a tipping point, set in 1997, when Shin Do Mabardi, Veronika's brother, adopted from Korea, died suddenly in a car accident. Veronika Mabardi unravels childhood memories, in the whirlwind of the 70s; it draws up the cartography of this improbable encounter, within a mixed family.





The story begins in a rather ordinary way: a young girl is about to live for a few months in Brazil during her final year of college. Her parents accompany her to discover the country. What could be the story of a journey punctuated by encounters, music and the discovery of a people will quickly take another turn...

The trip turns tragic when the trio finds themselves face to face with two armed bandits. Time accelerates and yet seems to freeze. in a paradoxical double movement specific to decisive moments. What is being played out in these seconds is impalpable. Everyone's thoughts unfold: contradictions, fears, desires, survival instinct are summoned.
